## NOTICE OF HEARING AND NOTICE TO ATTEND AS WITNESS

On or between February, 2021 – May, 2021, you failed to maintain appropriate boundaries with client , the particulars of which include:

 a. Engaged in communications with of a romantic and personal nature;
 b. Texted with and spoke to for purposes unrelated to treatment.

 You engaged in sexual abuse toward client the particulars of which include:

 a. You provided occupational therapy treatment to on several occasions between February 4, 2021-February 23, 2021;
 b. On or about February 20, 2021, you commenced a sexual relationship with ...
 c. You continued to engage in conduct of a sexual nature, including sexual intercourse, with thereafter until May, 2021 when your relationship ended;
 d. You engaged in the conduct identified above at 2(a) – (c) while was still a

IT IS FURTHER ALLEGED THAT your conduct constitutes "unprofessional conduct" as defined in s. 1(1)(pp)(i)(ii)(xii) of the *Health Professions* Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. H-7 (the "HPA"), in particular:

"patient" as defined in Standard 10 of ACOT's Standards of Practice.

1. Your conduct with respect to allegation #1 contravenes one or more of the following:

a. Standards of Practice: Standard 1: Maintain Professional Accountability;

b. Code of Ethics: Principles 2.1; 2.2.

2. Your conduct in relation to allegation #2:

a. Constitutes "sexual abuse" as defined in s. 1(1)(nn.1) of the Health Professions

Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. H-7 (the "HPA") and contravenes Standard of Practice:

Standard 10: Maintain Appropriate Boundaries;

b. Contravenes ACOT's Code of Ethics: Principles 2.1; 2.2.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to section 72(1) of the HPA, you are required

to attend at the said time and place in person, and you are compelled to give evidence and

produce models, charts, documents, papers, notes, records, and other material relevant to the

Hearing Tribunal.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that in the event that you do not attend at the said time and

place, the Hearing Tribunal may proceed in your absence pursuant to section 79(6) of the HPA,

and you will not be entitled to any further notice of the proceedings.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that in the event you do not attend at the said time and

place, your failure to comply with the Notice to Attend may result in a further complaint and

may constitute unprofessional conduct.
