### Appointments

If more applications are received than available Council vacancies, Council will appoint three new Councillors based on an analysis of desired skills and attributes for Council.

### Commitment:

- Meetings are usually nine times per year, including in person and videoconference options.
- In person meetings are usually in Edmonton or Calgary, all day on a Saturday.
- Videoconference meetings are currently held on Monday or Tuesday evenings.

ACOT's Council consists of up to eight voting members – four regulated OT members and four public members who are appointed by the Alberta government – and up to two non-voting regulated OT members.

For 2026 there are three open Council positions for OTs. Please refer to the application package for a description of desired skills and attributes of Council members.
